



One morning as I was walking into the school hall to prepare for a senior form assembly, I met a lady who was almost 6 feet tall. Not only her height, but also her brilliant and cheerful smile impressed me at that moment.

After an introduction, finally I realized that she was the guest speaker that morning. She is Wu Lai Fong, Anna. People call her Madam Wu. She was one of the first female firefighters ever recruited by the Fire Services Department of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region.

Serving as a Senior Station Officer now, Madam Wu finds her job meaningful by being able to save lives from different dangerous fires and emergencies. However, through her pragmatic frontline job experience these years, she admits that life is short and fragile. Nothing can make her take pride in herself but only the true GOD she trusts in because she knows HE is the ONE who gives life and saves life.

Born as a premature baby in a grass-root family, Anna's mother described that her body was only the size of her hand. Suffering from different diseases since her childhood, young Anna also needed to



apprehensively face her different despondent family problems. She had to look after her little brother when she was only fourteen years old as her parents were both absent from their family for years. Due to her great difficulties and traumatic experiences in life, she had even thought of giving up her life once. Fortunately, complex vicissitudes did not make her throw in the towel but instead she found hope in Jesus. She regained her faith and gallantry. After putting in her best effort and striking for her best, she finally became a secondary school P.E. teacher. Sharing her life with students helped her realize that life is full of values and colors.

In 1993, she applied for a post as a Station Officer offered by the Fire Services Department. Later, she got accepted and her series of tough training also started. In her current book, Madam Wu shares the frontline experiences of her job with readers. She claims that she still has no fear of continuing her job, although she has to face the life-and-death situations all the time, since being able to serve society through her job is a mission. She wants to earnestly carry on that mission. Her great salute to all firefighters sacrificed in 9/11 clearly proves her commitment to it as well.



It's called Spider-Man 3. Spider-Man, who is called Peter Parker, has turmoil when contending with new villains, temptations and revenge.






Recommendation of Movies By 2C.

Watching movies is most people's favourite pastime. In Henrietta Secondary School, there are many teachers and students who like watching movies too. Do you want to know which type of movies they like and why? Well, let me tell you about the survey we conducted in October, 2007. We invited our English teachers and all Form 2 students to fill in a questionnaire and this is what we have come up with.



Most teachers like comedy movies because they think comedies are relaxing and enjoyable. However, they don't like horror films, cartoons, musicals and kung fu films. Students like comedies, cartoons and actions films because they are funny, exciting and

interesting to watch. They don't like romance, horror films and documentary films. When choosing a movie to watch, teachers consider the story first and then the actor/actress or the film reviewers' recommendations. Like teachers, students consider the story first, and then their friends' recommendations and the actor/actress. None of them considers the director and only a few of them consider the film reviewers' recommendations.

Most of the teachers usually see movies with friends or families. But none of them likes to go alone. They usually watch movies at cinemas and a few of them rent VCDs or DVDs to watch at home. Most students see movies with friends too. Some go with parents. Only a few go alone or with classmates, cousins or relatives. About two third of them

watch movies at cinemas and the rest like to rent VCDs or DVDs and watch at home.

How often do teachers watch movies? Well, some of them watch a movie every two to three months. But most of them only watch movies when there are great ones worth seeing. So, the amount of money they spend on watching movies is not definite or less than \$100 a month. About half of the students watch movies whenever there are great ones worth seeing. A quarter of them watch movies every one to three months. Only a few of them watch movies every week. The money students spend on watching movies ranges from \$100 to \$200. But most of them spend no definite amount or less than \$100. Very few spend over \$200.



Watching movies is not only a great pastime but also a great learning opportunity for both teachers and students. So let's all sit back, relax and enjoy our favourite movies!


