Cheung: How long have you been playing Gu Zheng?

Ying: I have been playing it since I was in primary six. Up to this month, I have learnt it for

four full years.

Cheung: Why did you choose playing Gu Zheng but not other instruments?

Ying: The reason I chose it because the player looks artistic and wise with the Zheng The wonderful sound of the Zheng also attracts me a lot. I think each string from the instrument can make a terrific bit that makes audience feel comfortable and relaxed. Another reason is that I was recommended by one of my primary school teachers to join a government's subsidized music programme for training students to play musical instruments. I like Chinese music. Compared with other instruments, I think Gu Zheng looks more professional and cool.

Cheung: What do you think the most difficult part of playing Gu Zheng?

Ying: Since Gu Zheng can have thirteen to twentyfive metal or nylon strings. As a girl like me, it is very difficult for me to apply the force with brisk movements of my fingers into it. However, through daily training, I have learnt how to control it proficiently.

Cheung: During the process of Gu Zheng training, what have you learnt other than just the music knowledge?



Ying:

I think playing Gu Zheng teaches me how to be patient, concentrated and hardworking. Since the training occupies me almost two hours a day on weekly basis, it's easy to give up if I do not persist in it. I used to be a less motivated and quiet person. My parents even thought that I would give it up when I started playing it. However, my hardworking and assiduous attitude helps me break through all my limitations and makes me success in different music competitions. Playing Gu Zheng makes me feel confident. Through joining competitions and public performances, I have gained a lot of valuable experiences that also enhance my skills. Furthermore, I was a shy and passive girl but now I have become active and outgoing after I learnt to play Gu Zheng. Therefore, 'no pain, no gain' is the principle if you want to succeed in everything. Just like learning English, you should keep working hard without giving it up although you may encounter difficulties. 'Practice Makes Perfect' is a universal rule of success.




